## ***Animal Undergoes Cataract Surgery In Boston***

**BOSTON** -- A 12-year-old Chinese Crested will see its owner for the first time in two years after its vision was restored at Angell Animal Medical Center in Boston.

Bobo, who lost its vision to cataracts, underwent surgery Tuesday by Dr. Martin Coster.

"Bobo has had a host of medical issues over the past several years, including diabetes, that postponed his cataract surgery," said Coster. "Cataracts are quite common in older canines and there is a high success rate for sight recovery in certain candidates."
